

## Overview

### **Target Range Sewer & Water District** (a regional district chartered by the State of Montana)

- The Target Range Sewer & Water District is a regional district chartered by the state of Montana. It was originally organized in 2000 to protect the water quality of the Missoula Aquifer in the Target Range area.
- The District has been expanded three times by a request of the residents who lived outside the original boundaries and felt they would be better served if they were included in the district.
- The District does not currently intend to install sewer and water systems within the district. The District's approach is through conservation and wise use of the existing septic and well infrastructure that currently exists in our area. However the District has the authority to implement these systems if required.
- You can see by our list of value added services how we protect our life style and make sure it is there for future generations. It would be impossible to accomplish any of these objectives without proper funding and leadership in place to coordinate the ever-increasing sewer and water-related issues within the District.
- Your support in joining the District will help us in maintaining and protecting our way of life.

## Value Added Services

- The District is a voice of the Target Range/Orchard Homes people at the City, County, State and Federal levels.
- The District provides risk management as it pertains to ground contamination and aquifer protection. It also identifies and resolves potential risks.
- The District shares community planning and protection with the Target Range Homeowners Association.
- Our standard is to maintain water quality levels that meet or exceed Federal and State requirements for health and safety.
- We have a website, a social media presence and a newsletter that includes articles, news, and issues that educate and inform homeowners, saving them time and money in maintaining their water and septic systems.
- The District Board of Directors is elected from and by the people of Target Range & Orchard Homes.
- The District Board members and engineering staff conduct field visits with property owners to review and correct sewer problems or answer questions that they may have.
- The District has established a grant program that provides financial assistance to our property owners for upgrades and replacements of their water treatment systems.
- The Board manages our greatest natural resources—WATER.

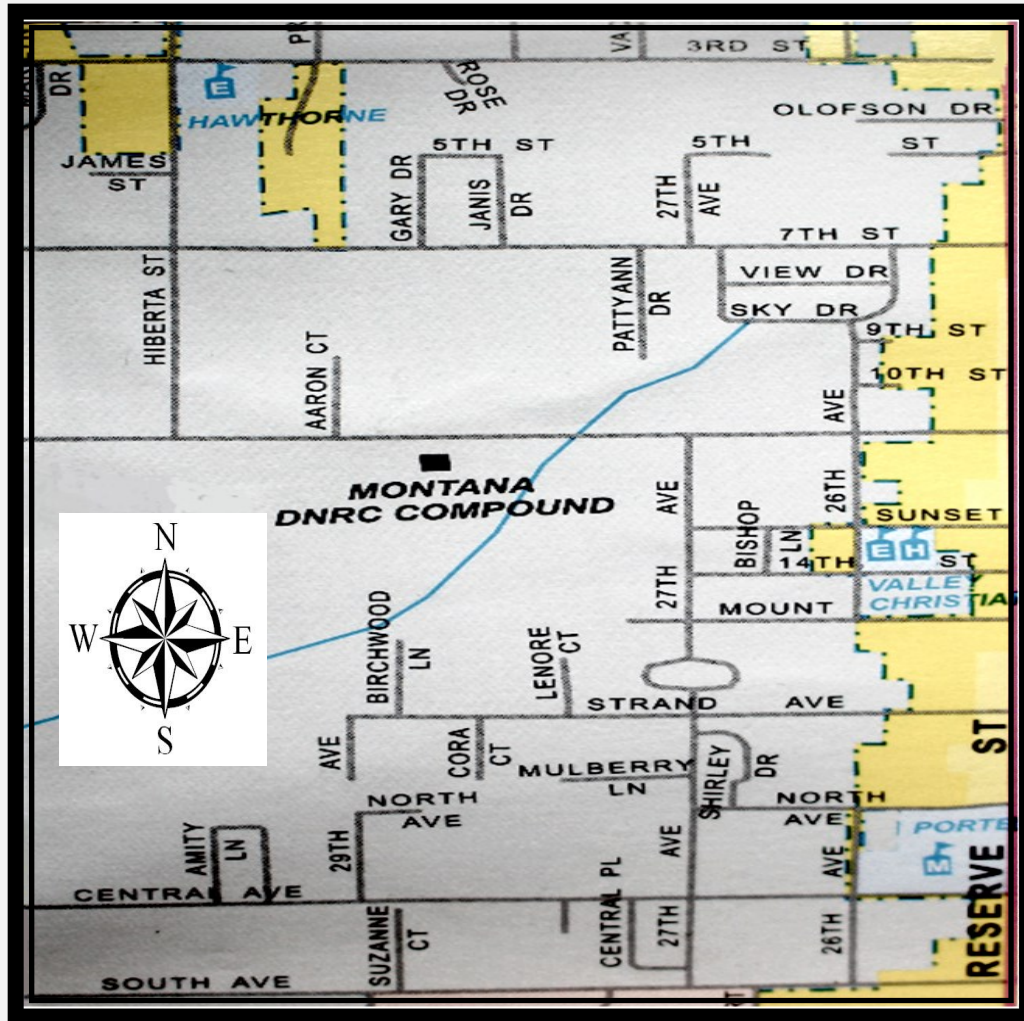
